Summaries Rubric

Points	Neatness	Grammar (Punctuation, Capitalization & Spelling)	Quality
0	My work is sloppy and hard to read.	I didn't reread my writing. There are lots of punctuation, capitalization and spelling crimes.	I don't have at least 2 sentences. My summary isn't specific and doesn't show that I read.
1	Some of my work is sloppy and hard to read.	I didn't reread all my writing. There are some punctuation, capitalization and spelling crimes.	Only some of my summaries are at least 2 sentences and show that I read.
2	My writing is neat and easy to read.	I reread my writing. There are almost no punctuation, capitalization or spelling crimes.	My summaries are more than 2 sentences. They show I read because they are specific to the story or informational text I read that night.
